# SPROUT SUMMER LONCH PROGRAM

### Background

Sprout Summer Lunch Program completed its third successful summer. This initiative aims to ensure families in Teton County have access to healthy, nutritious lunches throughout the 12 weeks of summer.

This summer's efforts focused on strengthening existing community relationships to bolster utilization of existing Sprout access points including camp deliveries, Sprout Mobile, and Sprout Stands. We added new partners to our activity offerings, offered local businesses a chance to cook food for the menu, incorporated community built public art structures, and for the first time had a 100% Spanish-speaking Sprout Team. All of this is in addition to our tried and true partnerships such as Teton County Library's free books and One22's Unified Summer Scholarships.

The community outreach efforts paid off, as the Sprout Mobile and Sprout Stands saw a 23% and 92% increase in daily use, respectively. Overall, 7331 lunches were served, a 24% increase compared to 2021.



## Sprout Stands progress

In 2021, we launched the Sprout Stands as an after-work access point, Monday-Thursday, 5-6pm. In their first year, Sprout Stands provided lunches for families who could not make it during the regular hours, but it did not have the usage we had hoped.

This year, after gathering feedback from participants, we moved the time back to allow more time for parents returning from work. We also built relationships with leaders in those communities so they could spread the word amongst themselves.

On top of these efforts, JH Public Art constructed beautiful stands with repurposed materials that provided a physical beacon to indicate free lunches. These efforts led to a 92% increase in daily lunches distributed at the Sprout Stands.
