Sprout Summer Lunch Program completed its fourth successful summer. This initiative aims to ensure families in Teton County have access to healthy, nutritious lunches throughout the 11 weeks of summer. This summer's efforts focused on strengthening existing community relationships to bolster the utilization of existing Sprout access points including camp deliveries, Sprout Mobile, and Sprout Stands. We added new partners to our activity offerings, offered local businesses a chance to cook food for the menu, and incorporated two new locations: Cottonwood Park & Phil Baux Park. All of this is in addition to our tried and true partnerships such as Teton County Library's free books and One22's Unified Summer Scholarships.
